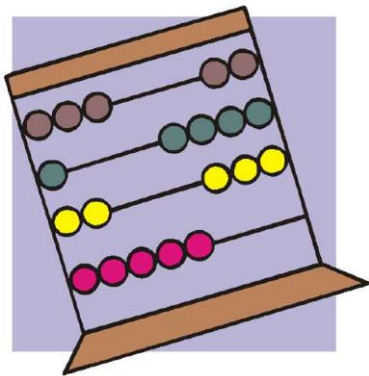

Now that you know 1-20, how do you count to 100?

*First you need to be able to count to 100 by tens:



- 10 decem
- 20 viginti
- 30 triginta
- 40 quadraginta
- 50 quinquaginta
- 60 sexaginta
- 70 septuaginta
- 80 octoginta
- 90 nonaginta
- 100 centum

*For 1-20, use the numbers in the chart above.

*Beginning with 21, follow these rules:

For 21-27: *viginti unus, viginti duo, viginti tres, viginti quattuor*, etc.

For 28: *duodetriginta* (Literally “two from thirty”)

For 29: *undetriginta* (Literally “one from thirty”)

The 30’s through the 90’s will follow the same rules as the 20’s.
